

Family Learning Toolkit – Parents Handbook Library of 12 comics

As you read the comic "Plastic in our Ocean" with your child, you may come across some new words, don't worry, we have included a glossary at the end of the comic to help you understand these terms. Having a glossary at the end of the comic is helpful because it provides a quick reference for any unfamiliar words that may come up while reading with a child.

Additionally, we have included some tips on how to get your child thinking about plastic and its impact on the environment.

Encourage your child to look around the next time you go shopping and identify how many products are packaged in plastic. Help them understand that much of this packaging is unnecessary and brainstorm ways your household can reduce its use of plastic. These may include using a recyclable bag instead of a plastic one, choosing paper straws over plastic straws, and avoiding buying food that has unnecessary plastic packaging. Remember, if you must use plastic, always reuse or recycle it.

Carbon Footprint is a comic that can help parents educate their children about ways to reduce their carbon footprint. A carbon footprint is a measure of how much carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases are released into the environment as a result of our actions. The more greenhouse gases we produce, the higher our carbon footprint. Global warming is the increase in the earth's temperature caused by the release of high levels of carbon dioxide and other gases into the atmosphere.

Children can also participate in an activity by coloring in a picture of a footprint, writing or drawing ways to reduce their carbon footprint, using bright colors to make it stand out, and displaying their poster where people can see it.

EXPLORING THE DIGITAL WORLD

Engagement of the kids

The comic Exploring the digital world is a great resource for parents to help teach their children about online safety. The comic covers topics for a responsible online behavior. The language used is easy to understand for children and it contains illustrations that will grab their attention and help them retain the information.

Activity for Children: DESIGN YOUR OWN ONLINE SAFETY AVATAR OR MASCOT!

Creating their own avatar or mascot is a fun and creative way for children to learn about online safety. Parents can use the glossary provided to explain some of the terms that may be new to them, and then encourage them to create their own avatar or mascot that represents their values and reflects safe online behavior.

Steps to follow:

- Start by explaining what an avatar is and show them some examples.
- Discuss with your child what kind of values and behaviors they want their avatar to represent, such as kindness, respect, or privacy.
- Encourage them to sketch out some ideas for their avatar, using the comic illustrations as inspiration if needed.
- Once they have their design, help them create their avatar using a digital tool or by drawing and coloring it on paper.

The comic also explores the concept of body image and how it affects young people's self-esteem. As a parent, you may not be familiar with some of the terms used in the comic, so we have included a short glossary to help you understand them better. We encourage you to read the comic with your child and discuss the themes it explores.

Tips for parents:

Social media platforms like Instagram can put a lot of pressure on young people to look a certain way. It's important to have open and honest conversations with your child about body image and the influence of social media. Encourage your child to focus on the things they like about themselves, and not to compare themselves to others. If you notice that your child is spending a lot of time on social media or is struggling with their body image, talk to them about it and seek help if necessary.

Activity for children:

To help children feel good about themselves, you can encourage them to create a "Feel Good Poster". All they need is some coloured pencils or pens, a piece of paper, and some blue tack or sellotape. Have your child draw a picture of themselves and write down all the good things about themselves. Encourage them to use bright colours and to stick their poster somewhere they can see it. This way, when they feel sad or upset, they can look at their poster to cheer themselves up and remember all the good things about themselves.
