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The FAMILY FOOTPRINTS Project outlines an Innovative Approach to Digital and Climate Literacy for Families

Throughout this project, we provided support to families through the “Dual Transition” and helped them in managing carbon and digital footprints in their household. We accomplished that by creating:

1. Induction to Pedagogy Programme for Parents
2. The Dual Transition: Digital and Climate Literacy Programme for Parents
3. Family Learning Toolkit
4. In-service Training Programme for Community and Adult Educators

Induction to Pedagogy Programme for Parents

Training was conducted for parents who wanted to acquire knowledge and skills in the field of digital and climate literacy. Participants expressed positive feedback, acknowledging the practicality of the information and tips shared and with the hope of using them in their everyday life.





The Dual Transition: Digital and Climate Literacy Programme for Parents

We implemented workshops consisting of 12 short modules that addressed two key areas: digital literacy and climate awareness and action.

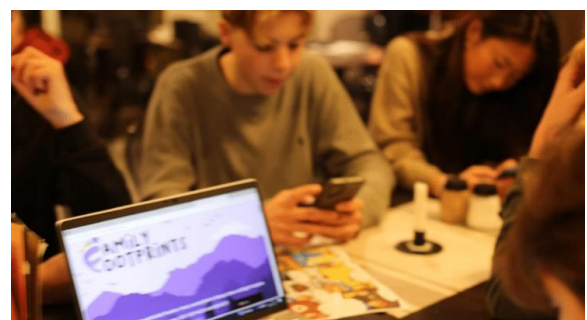
In each country, the workshop was attended by 10 families who described the experience as enriching and insightful. For some parents, the topic of climate literacy was a novel concept. They appreciated getting tips on how to apply parental control to digital devices and how to efficiently find all relevant information online.



Family Learning Toolkit

Comprehensive Family Learning Toolkit contains materials for family members of various ages. We developed 12 thematic comic strips for children, 12 interactive magazines for teenagers and 8 audiobooks for senior adult learners and grandparents. It's an innovative and engaging way to educate about digital and climate literacy.

Feedback from the various family members highlighted the pedagogical nature of comics, the engaging layout of magazines, and the suitability of audiobooks for elderly individuals and those with reading challenges.



In-service Training Programme for community and adult educators

It's aimed at adult educators to successfully prepare them to effectively use educational resources. The in-service training comprises 60 hours of instruction made up of 28 hours of hands-on workshop learning and 32 hours of online self-directed learning.



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We developed Workshop lesson plans, Lesson plan Templates, presentations and Self-directed learning handbooks. The feedback from the participating adult educators was overwhelmingly positive.
